


This is a really nice bookshop crawl, because it's all within walking distance and there's such a great range of different types of bookshop to explore.

You have two options for start points, either start at Waterstones Gower Street (82 Gower St, WC1E 6EQ), which has both cafe and the largest selection of second hand and new books in Europe, or at The Cartoon Museum (63 Wells St, W1A 3AE). When you've browsed to your hearts content, head up the road to Treadwells (33 Store Street, WC1E 7BS), a really unique indie bookshop specialising in the occult with a really interesting range of fiction and non fiction. From here another short walk will bring you to Oxfam's flagship bookshop (12 Bloomsbury St, WC1B 3QA), where you can easily loose a surprising amount of time browsing!

This is the route which includes not one but two specialist in the occult (if this isn't your usual thing I urge you to give them both a try as they contain a multitude of interesting and unexpected titles and are both run by lovely, fascinating people!). Your next stop is London's oldest occult bookshop, still family run, The Atlantis Bookshop (49A Museum St, WC1A 1LY) where you're guaranteed to find something interesting! Just around the corner is the London Review Bookshop (14-16 Bury Place, WC1A 2JL), filled with a range of fiction, focusing on the literary, and non-fiction across all genres.

The final stop for this route is Jarndyce Antiquarian Booksellers, specialists in 18th and 19th century books and housed opposite the British Museum.
